FREE INSTRUCTION

PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum contributions for nonitems and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES
